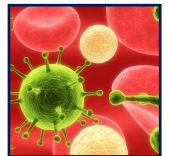
### Our new intake

In September 2016, 26 new Postgraduate Diploma students started the programme. This new cohort represents our largest intake yet, bringing a wide range of experience from 17 different countries across Africa, Australasia, Europe, and the Americas. We had the pleasure of greeting many of our new students in person at the Introductory Day in October, and look forward to meeting all of our Year 1 students at the IIC course in June.



### The Paediatric Infectious Diseases Programme

Drawing on world-class research and teaching in paediatric infectious diseases, the programme offers a unique opportunity to gain an understanding of the principles that underpin infection and the ways in which those principles have developed, and to translate this understanding into good clinical and research practice.



The two-year part-time Postgraduate Diploma is taught via a blend of online and residential components. It has been designed to direct students through the syllabus required in the EU for clinical training in the subspecialty, and is also appropriate for those outside the EU. Following on from the Postgraduate Diploma, the MSc programme provides an essential step forward for those interested in continuing training in the subspecialty. The MSc involves an additional year of study in the UK or overseas, during which students undertake a supervised research project and submit a 15,000 word dissertation. 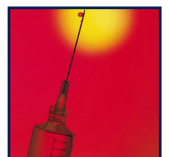


Applicants will have experience working in paediatrics, should hold a specialist qualification equivalent to the Membership Examination of the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health (MRCPCH), and will usually be registered in a national clinical training programme, where applicable.
